Vet SOS clients who: (1) have had their pets spayed or neutered; (2) returned their signed eligibility letter within 12 months; and (3) have attended a Vet SOS clinic in the last 12 months are eligible for up to \$250 a year in financial assistance for **urgent** veterinary care at the San Francisco SPCA.

Offers financial assistance for unhoused pet owners needing emergency veterinary care. Call their headquarters to be connected with a case manager. If you are eligible, the manager will approve an exam and have you call and make an appointment for your pet to be seen at a local clinic.
